Brafferton & Helperby Parish Council Meeting Minutes

Wednesday 17 April 2024 Held in the Village Hall at 7.30pm

- 1. Apologies for Absence
 - 1.1. Apologies were received from Cllr Pam Jackson-Vickers.
- 2. Declarations of Interest not already declared under the Council's Code of Conduct or members Register of Disclosable Pecuniary Interests
 - 2.1. No declarations were made.
- 3. Chairman's report:
 - 3.1. A suitable candidate had come forward for co-option to the Lands & Maintenance committee. The Council was pleased to co-opt Dan Knight onto the committee.
 - 3.2. A gardener Ken Westerman had been found to maintain the narrow borders running from the St Peter's lych gate. The Council still seeks someone to maintain the sloping border between the churchyard wall and 8 Bridge Street.
 - 3.3. Advice had been received that works are planned to the footpaths beside the Raskelf Road. No details are available but it is hoped that this work is in response to the Council's report on the condition of these paths.
 - 3.4. Chairman hopes to engage with Cllr Keane (North Yorkshire Council) on 26 Apr when he visits Helperby as part of his Yorkshire mayoral campaign.
- 4. Public Participation
 - 4.1. The MoP described the amended plan for the solar farm at Pilmoor 15.5 refers and introduced his research on Community Benefit (CB) grants from other solar farm projects. Chairman confirmed that the Council had already made its own submission for CB.
- 5. News from North Yorkshire Council (NYC)
 - 5.1. No information was available.

 - 9.1. The end of FY 2023/24 balance was £11,438.83 of which £4,388.63 was Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) money which can only be spent on infrastructure. Consequently, the Council's effective reserves stood at £7,050.20 this level of reserves was less than half that recommended for a council of our size and £10k would be a healthier position.
- 10. Budget FY 2024/25 review:
 - 10.1. Clerk and Chairman had reviewed the budget produced in Nov 23, identifying two potential savings totalling £500. Chairman proposed that these changes were adopted and the savings made be transferred into reserves **resolved**.

Chairman commented that the Council had no volunteer group of its own to run such events and thought the current arrangements worked well; he also confirmed that the Council would always consider making grants on a broadly equitable basis to each event.
